

What to Look For

Tunnels— Coneheads travel to their feeding sites in narrow, brown tunnels, on the sides of trees, houses, fences, or other surfaces.



Swarmers— In spring, winged coneheads leave their old nests and fly to a new location to start another colony, which is how the termite infestation spreads. Dark wings distinguish conehead swarmers from other local termites.



Nests— These termites build large, dark brown nests with a hard bumpy surface. Nests can be on, in, or by trees or structures, or on open ground and are sometimes hidden within vegetation.
