

**JOINT FEDERAL, STATE, LOCAL
PUBLIC NOTICE
September 27, 2019**

The Federal Emergency Management Agency and Florida Division of Emergency Management have received the following application for Federal grant funding. Final notice is hereby given of the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) consideration to provide funding in the form of Hazard Mitigation Grant Program. Funds will be provided in accordance with Section 404 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, Public Law 93-288, as amended.

Under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), federal actions must be reviewed and evaluated for feasible alternatives and for social, economic, historic, environmental, legal, and safety considerations. Under Executive Order (EO) 11988 and EO 11990 FEMA is required to consider alternatives to and to provide public notice of any proposed actions in or affecting floodplains or wetlands. EO 12898 also requires FEMA to provide the opportunity for public participation in the planning process and to consider potential impacts to minority or low-income populations.

Funding for the proposed project will be conditional upon compliance with all applicable federal, tribal, state and local laws, regulations, floodplain standards, permit requirements and conditions.

Location of Proposed Work:

The area affected by this project consists of homes and structures in the following locations:

Lift Station No. 1 – 50 SE 2 nd Avenue	Lift Station No. 11 – 1700 NE 7 th Avenue
Lift Station No. 2 - 400 SW 2 nd Avenue	Lift Station No. 12 – 495 Taylor Lane

Proposed Work and Purpose:

Install new 1,200 GPM capacity pumps and control panels at 9 sanitary sewer lift station locations. This will increase the pump capacity by 400 GPM. Install permanent 150 kW diesel generators at the 9 lift stations.

Project Alternatives:

The alternatives to the project that have been and will be considered are 1) the no action alternative and 2) Continually repair of failing pumps. During power interruptions, use portable generators. These alternatives to the proposed project are not viable because under Alternative 1) Repetitive flooding and lift station failure does not alleviate the health, safety and welfare danger and the needs of the community would not be served.; and Alternative 2) Protection to the community during flood events would be uncertain. The City does not have staff to operate 9 lift station portable generator during flooding events. Operating temporary pumps is cost prohibitive therefore not practicable.

Comment Period:

Comments are solicited from the public; local, state or federal agencies; and other interested parties in order to consider and evaluate the impacts of the proposed project. The comments should be made in writing and addressed to the Florida Division of Emergency Management, Bureau of Mitigation, 2555 Shumard Oak Blvd., Tallahassee, FL 32399-2100. These are due within 15 days of this notice 10/12/2019. The State will forward comments to applicable regulatory agencies as needed.
